
What is Challenge?

We believe that each child should be nurtured to their fullest potential. By providing an enriched platform with their like-minded peers, we address their social-emotional needs as well as their academic skill set.



How Is It Organised?

At Tuart Hill Primary School selected students are divided into two age groups.

Junior Challenge: Pre-Primary - Year 3

Senior Challenge: Years 4 - 6

Senior Challenge consists of multi-age sessions which occur Wednesday mornings at 7:30 – 8:25am.

Junior Challenge occurs during the school day on Wednesdays at 11am - 12pm.

• **Term One:** Year 3 students

• **Term Two:** Year 2 students

• Term Three: Year 1 students

• **Term Four**: PrePrimary students

How Is My Child Chosen?

Our process is based on the most recent research in identifying those capable highly abled students. We utilize multi-measure process consisting of standardised testing, ability testing, classroom performance and teacher nominations.

There are two major intakes for Senior Challenge which occur at the beginning of each semester.

With the beginning of each Semester, families are invited to an information session to outline the focus for the forthcoming cycle of Challenge students. Families are asked to commit for the entirety of the semester.

Lessons are varied and are collaborative in nature. There are opportunities to discover, debate and investigate topics. Students are strongly encouraged to be curious and to think deeply about the subject that they are investigating.
