The Phase Four COVID Government Guidelines for School Sporting events at Government schools reads that:

- *Assemblies and other school community events can occur. Adult visitors and staff should maintain physical distancing of one person per two square metres.*
- *Contact sport and training can occur. Equipment may be shared, however schools should ensure equipment is cleaned regularly, ie. after use. Encourage good hygiene practices including handwashing before and after sport.*
- *Interschool activities can occur. **Encourage good hygiene practices** including handwashing before and after activities. Supervisors/staff should maintain physical distancing of one person per two square metres where practicable. (Update 20 August 2020)*

Faction Jumps and Throws Monday 31 August 2020

The above Government Rules mean that parents may come onto the school grounds to watch their child/ren compete. If you are keen, please ask your child if they are selected, and when their time for jumps and throws will be.

We ask that you come in through the Front Office to SIGN IN AND THEN OUT for contact tracing purposes if required – we will ask for your name and phone number. Thank you.

Hand sanitiser will be available at the front office table; please pack your own mini dispenser for use once you are inside the school grounds, thank you.

Faction Athletics and Novelty Games Day Friday 11 September 2020

Regarding our Faction Athletics Carnival – we have taken extra advice from [School Sports WA](#) that relates to Phase 4:

- *owing to the 2 square metre physical distancing requirements for adults, SSWA requests that participating schools request that parents do not attend events*
- *If parents attend as spectators, a limit of one parent per participant has been set and they are to stay on site only for the time that their child is involved in events*

It is very important to ensure our school follows Government rules. It is a legal requirement that we continue to be vigilant all across Western Australia for the health and wellbeing of us all. The school risks a police fine if we are found to be breaching Phase Four rules, and it is rumoured that such a fine has been imposed upon a school.

Our Faction Carnival commences with a crowd on the top oval, then we disperse around the school as the students compete in various events, and we come back together at the end for the Relays and Presentations.

Based on the difficulty of actually fitting all our supporters inside our school grounds with social distancing, please decide if it is really necessary for you to attend this year. If you want to come along to support your child/ren, perhaps consider one member from each family attending at any one time.

Remember to enter the School through the Front Office, sign in, sanitise, and sign out when you leave. It is each adult's own responsibility to socially distance.

Tragically, Gary has since lost his life due to cancer in 2011, however, his legacy lives on to help many other people through this caring initiative.

R U OK day is about reaching out to those around you and starting a conversation, commenting on changes you might have noticed and supporting people through their challenges. So how do you start a conversation like "R U OK"?

Your Move – More Ways to get to School

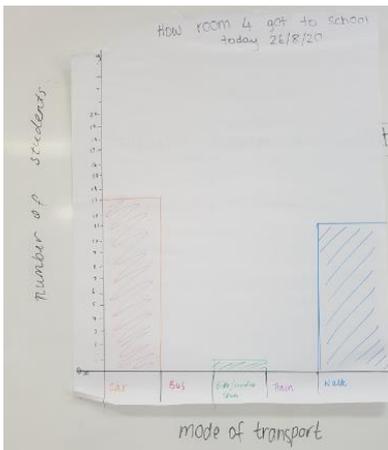

First sessions are always free!

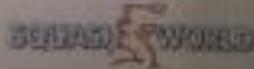
Cost: Annual registration: \$60 (includes free eye exam)
