Principal's Message: Beverly Innes

Dear Parents and Carers,

It's great to be back at work! I really enjoy chatting to the students, laughing with the staff and reconnecting with you as I see you around. Warm thanks, Keira, for leading the team safely through the most trying Term of any school year. Our whole school community has worked together to ensure that school is open for learning, with health and wellbeing foremost in our minds

This Term has seen the <u>Health protocols return to baseline</u>, which brings its own changes of course. Students should stay home if they are unwell, as usual, however if they test positive to COVID, please inform us.

- A positive COVID test means the student must isolate for 7 days, then return to school as long
 as no symptoms remain. The School will contact you to arrange for work packages that your
 child can complete if they are well enough.
- Close Contact rules are not in play. Siblings should attend school if they are well and do not test positive. Siblings need to take a RAT and receive a negative result every day to attend school.
- Masks no longer mandatory at school except for in specific settings and circumstances. Masks are encouraged for staff and students (Year 7 and above) where physical distancing is not possible. Any person may continue to wear a mask in any circumstance of course.
- Density and capacity limits no longer apply to school activities. We will return to Assemblies every fortnight, Junior and Senior alternating as before. All regular school activities will be arranged. Parents are welcome to attend any event you like, and certainly you will be invited to special events eg receiving a Merit Award.
- Parents are welcome on school site and may be invited to volunteer in classrooms again.
- An additional supply of RATs for all students and staff are soon to be delivered to the school.
 Additional test kits will be supplied to each of our families once the RATs arrive; watch out for
 a Connect notice regarding this. In the meantime, if you find you are low on RATs, please ask
 if we have any we can give you I hold a small supply I am happy to share for emergency need.
