Principal's Message: Beverly Innes


Dear Parents and Carers,

It's been a busy week for our Year Three and Five students who have completed a NAPLAN test Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday. We will now take the time to 'catch up' with any students who missed their tests due to unexpected absences. Thank you for your support, doing your best to make sure your children attend for these important National tests, but also – keeping your children home if they are unwell.

Our student lists indicate that nearly 75% of our families have collected their **FREE Rapid Antigen Tests** from the Front Office. Please ask your friends if they have their free box of RATs, as this Government initiative will make it easier for families to monitor health. As the weather changes, we are having more incidents of flu-like symptoms and tummy aches across our school, which will generate a phone call from us to you to collect your unwell child. We do our best to look after your children but when they feel sick they only want their mum or dad; thank you for your prompt support.

A reminder about the <u>Health protocols return to baseline</u>, as we see cases of positive tests soar across our state. Students should stay home if they are unwell, as usual, however if they test positive to COVID, please inform us.

• A positive COVID test means the student must isolate for 7 days, then return to school as long as no symptoms remain. The School will contact you to arrange for work packages that your child can complete if they are well enough.



• Masks no longer mandatory at school except for in specific settings and circumstances. Any person may continue to wear a mask in any circumstance of course.

- Density and capacity limits no longer apply to school activities. We have returned to Assemblies every fortnight, Junior and Senior alternating as before. All regular school activities will be arranged. Parents are welcome to attend any event you like, and certainly you will be invited to special events eg receiving a Merit Award.
- Parents are welcome on school site and may be invited to volunteer in classrooms again.
