



SCHOOL DRESS CODE

Rationale

At Tuart Hill Primary School all students are expected to wear our school uniform. Research shows that wearing a school uniform assists students in developing a positive self image, encourages the development of pride in their school and provides a positive image to the local community.

Students may wear their Tuart Hill Primary School faction polo shirts on their timetabled Physical Education or whole school sports day.

Other Clothing

Tuart Hill Primary School endorses the wearing of the school uniforms and for students to comply to the school dress code. Leggings, tights and socks should be of a plain colour e.g. red, black or white.

The Department of Education (WA) has a 'No Denim' policy in all Public Schools, which we at Tuart Hill Primary School fully endorse. This policy applies to students as well as staff.

Students must wear the school uniform to:

- a) Represent the school at a sports carnival, school competition or a school assembly.
- b) Attend an excursion or any organised school activity.

Footwear

Students are expected to wear joggers, soft soled shoes or school shoes.

For health and safety reasons students are not permitted to wear high heeled shoes, boots, thongs, slip on shoes or shoes that do not enclose the whole foot. Students with injuries may seek permission from the principal to wear alternative footwear for a period of time.

Hats

We have a 'No hat no play in the sun' policy which operates all year round. Students at Tuart Hill Primary School are required to wear a red Tuart Hill Primary School bucket hat if they want to play in the sun.

Peaked caps and visors do not provide adequate protection from the sun, therefore students who wear these will be asked to go to a shaded area, as will be any student without a hat. It is recommended that hat strings be trimmed to remove excess string.

Hair

For health and safety reasons, all students with hair that is sitting below the bottom of their collar needs to be tied up. Any hair accessories are expected to be small and practical.

Jewellery

Students may wear a watch, medic alert bracelet, ear studs and small ear sleepers. For health and safety reasons, students are not permitted to wear any other jewellery.

Makeup

Students are encouraged to use lip balm and sunscreen. Tattoos or any other type of cosmetic including nail polish are not permitted. Students wearing nail polish will be provided with nail polish remover in order to remove it.

Religious Clothing & Jewellery

Students who wear the hijab or other head coverings should choose plain colours without patterning e.g. plain red, black or white. For health and safety reasons religious jewellery should not be worn at school. Please consult the principal regarding religious or cultural exemptions to this policy.

Uniform Shop

We have a fantastic band of parent volunteers who endeavour to open the Uniform Shop every second Monday from 8.30am – 9.00am, however we encourage parents to use the online uniform ordering option as a first choice. Orders are made up by the volunteers and delivered to your children's class at the earliest opportunity.
