#### **Principal's Message: Beverly Innes**

Dear Parents and Carers,

Keeping our Students Safe We have become aware that some of our students visit the Deli behind the school sometimes before and after school. We have asked the Storekeeper NOT to serve students wearing Tuart Hill uniform UNLESS they are accompanied with their parents. Please let your child know this change in operating procedures is in effect from now. There is no need for any student to stop off at the shop unsupervised. It is important that your child/ren are safely overseen by us once they arrive at school, and that your child goes directly home after school back into your care. Please see me directly if you have any queries regarding this change and thank you for your support in this matter.



<u>e-Cigarette use (Vaping)</u> The use of e-Cigarettes is in the News this week. Schools must be smoke-free environments, which includes tobacco and e-cigarette use. The Department of Education asks that Principals share some facts about vaping with parents; I have attached these to this eNews. Please see me directly if you have any concerns around vaping that the School might assist with, thank you.

<u>Caught up at Pick up?</u> From time to time parents may run late for the 2.50 pm end of school day student pick up. We understand that your lives are very busy and often over-committed; the traffic to and from and around our school at pick up time can also be an unpredictable muddle – there are lots of unforeseen reasons why you might not be at the classroom door at 2.50 pm for our educators to hand your child/ren into your care.

The staff at Tuart Hill are dedicated educators— our work certainly does not stop at 2.50 pm. Teachers plan parent catch-ups, collegiate meetings and other commitments after the final class bell. If your child has not been collected five or so minutes after the siren, our school procedure is that teachers or support staff escort them to the Front Office. If you are late to school pick up and your child and their bag is no longer outside the classroom, they will be in the Front Office. Please do not expect class teachers to put their commitments to one side to watch your child/ren if you are late — we will do that in the Front Office.

Should you be running late please ring 9413 1500 and the very helpful, understanding ladies in the Front Office will get the message to your child/ren, ensuring they are kept in the loop so they are not anxious about you. We bring your child/ren with their school bag to the Front Office where they wait under our supervision for you to arrive to collect them.



It is essential that you reinforce what you expect your child/ren to do once the 2.50 pm siren sounds as teachers relinquish duty of care at this time. Students are to **leave the school grounds** promptly at the end of class. Many students walk home – tell them to walk STRAIGHT home and try to monitor the time they take to get home to be assured they are doing as you have asked. If they are to come to Kiss 'n' Drive, reinforce that they arrive promptly. This keeps the traffic flowing and ensures our students are safely supervised into your care.

Some parents take a leisurely stroll out of the school grounds via the Junior Play Space or the Ninja Track. Its lovely to see the friendships that have developed between our families. However, students may only be on the playground if they are <u>under the supervision of their parents</u> – you now hold duty of care, so please ensure your children use school equipment safely and behave within school expectations. The siren will sound at **3.15 pm**, being a signal for you to **leave the school grounds** as external gates will be locked at 3.30pm.



Mulberry Tree After School Care have exclusive use of the Pre-Primary playground after school as part of their Hire conditions, so please do not be offended if you are asked to leave the PP playground unless you are there on After School Care business. Students who attach themselves to activities but are not enrolled in Afterschool Care will be firmly asked to leave by the Educators.

From time to time pre-arranged Netball, Basketball or Soccer training occurs on specific areas of the school. Students who attach themselves to these activities but are not on the Coach's List will be asked to leave.

I will contact the parents of students who persist in loitering unsupervised in the school grounds or who make poor choices after school to collect them directly from me in the Front Office, if I am required to consistently troubleshoot specific students at the end of the school day.

Thank you for your support in keeping all our students safe and ensuring respectful use of school equipment and the grounds.

#### **School Photos**

### **SCHOOL PHOTO DAY IS COMING!**

Dear Parents,

Your school photo day is coming! Approximately two weeks prior to the photo day every student will receive a personalised order envelope to bring home from Kapture Photography. The recommended method of ordering your photos is online through Kapture's website as your payment is secure and can be easily verified at any time. If you pay online, there is no need to return the order envelope to school.

#### **KEEP YOUR ORDER ENVELOPE SECURE!**

The unique codes contained on the envelope will be issued only once.

Alternatively, you can pay by cash and return the provided envelope to the school on the photography day. Please note the photographers cannot provide change.

#### Order **EARLY** for sibling photography

Sibling photos can ONLY be ordered online. Once you receive your envelope, it is imperative that you order your sibling photo early to avoid missing out! There is a physical limit in the school schedule to how many sibling photos can be taken. Once the maximum capacity of sibling orders has been reached, no more sibling orders can be placed.

If maximum capacity is not reached, sibling orders **close 12pm midday sharp**, <u>one business day prior</u> to the first photo day.

The school or the photographers <u>cannot</u> accept late orders for sibling photography. Please do not ask as your request simply cannot be accommodated.

#### Order EARLY for discount photo day prices

Order your photos within 10 calendar days of photo day to receive discount photo day prices. Late orders are handled separately to the school delivery and incur a \$30 custom service charge.

#### Other information

Late cash payment envelopes cannot be accepted by the school office or by Kapture.

Your school will notify you in a few weeks when **team and special group photos** are available to view and purchase on the Kapture website. Please note; class, individual and sibling portraits are not available to view online prior to purchase.

Kapture offer a money back guarantee for any parent who is not fully satisfied with their photo package. Should you have any queries before or after photo day, please check the FAQ's on the Kapture website.



All students will be photographed individually on photo day for school administration records AS WELL as included in their class group presentation available for purchase to all families. Should there be any reason why your child should **NOT** be included in the photo shoot –please contact the school office.

- Location North Metro TAFE Leederville and on work experience
- Qualification GATE (Gaining Access to Training and Employment) Certificate I
