The students really enjoyed this experience and we would like to thank Mrs Snart for organising this for us.



Do you know a student that needs support managing social and emotional challenges?

The **Secret Agent Society,** for children between the age of 8-12 years, is designed to empower children with the skills and confidence they need to recognise emotions, express feelings, and communicate and play with others.

Secret Agent Society



Empowering Your Child to Feel Happier, Calmer and Braver

SAS is an evidence-based social skills program for children aged between 8 to 12 years, with social and emotional challenges such as autism, ADHD and anxiety disorders.

The program is designed to empower children with the skills and confidence they need to; recognise emotions in themselves and others, express their feelings, acknowledge their thoughts, cope with feelings of anger and anxiety, communicate and play with others, build and maintain friendships and manage bullying.

To date, SAS interventions have helped more than 15,000 children and returned the most clinically significant change internationally.

What's Involved?

Children will attend 90 minute weekly club meetings for 9 weeks. This will be followed by 2, 1-hour follow up club meetings, 3-months apart. Parents are also required to attend an initial 2-hour information session, followed by 4, 2-hour group sessions.

Course details:

- Dates Starts week 1 of term 3 and runs for up to 20 weeks
- Many students finish the course early because they find work
- Days 3 days per week, Wednesday, Thursday, Friday 9:15 until 2:45
- Cost Approximately \$170 (subject to change) total course fee for full 20 weeks
- Location North Metro TAFE Leederville and on work experience
- Qualification GATE (Gaining Access to Training and Employment) Certificate I
