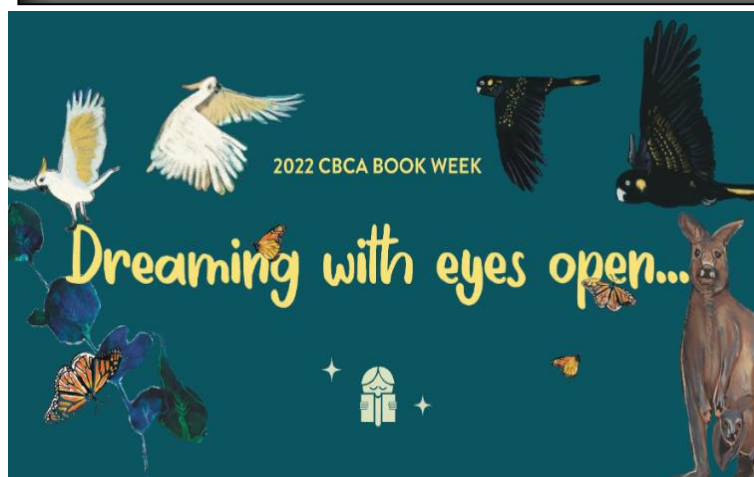

2022 BOOKWEEK



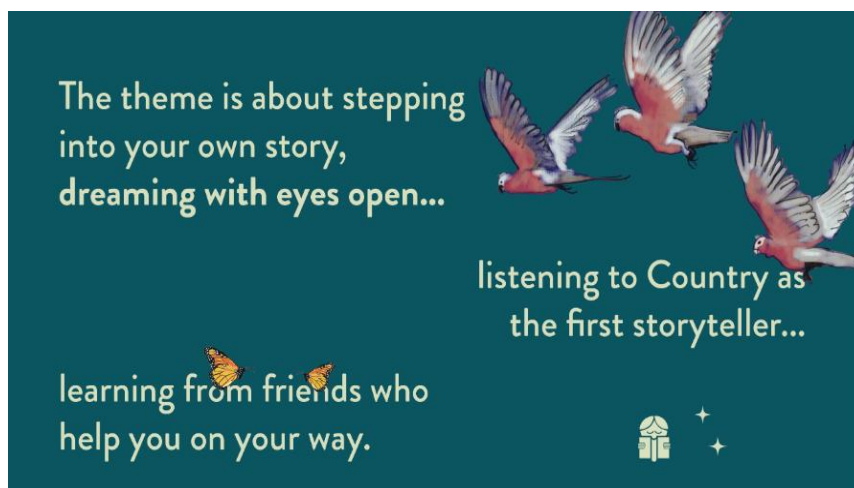
The 2022 Book Week Parade will be held on **Tuesday 23 August, 8.45 am ~9.20 am.**

2022 Talk Off

2021 Yr 1, 2 and 3 Talk- Off WINNERS



Talk Off is an annual competition that supports our students to speak clearly and confidently in public.

Part of the English Curriculum, Talk Off is a purposeful activity that creates a reason for writing a persuasive text or an explanation. Classroom lessons then help students to edit their 'talks' to contain a succinct message that has elements of a good speech. Student speak in front of a supportive audience first – a friend, then a small group then the whole class.

Each class collaboratively selects a confident speaker who has written then delivered an interesting speech to present their talk to either the 1,2and 3 classes (on Thursday 20 October, from 8.50 am in the Hall) or the 4,5 and 6 classes (on Friday 21 October, from 8.50 am in the Hall), and to be assessed by a panel of judges against the Public Speaking Rubric.

Students have time in class to prepare their Talk Off topics, but many students like to discuss their presentations with their parents / Carers, and to practise delivering their speech. To help you understand the focus of Talk Off, the following important points will be of interest:

• Week 2 Term 4 - Finalists deliver talks in the HALL

Junior Year 1,2,3, Thursday 20.10 8.50 - 10.15

Senior Year 4.5.6, Friday 21.10 8.50 - 10.15

• Timing

- Year 1 and 2 - 90 seconds
- Year 3 and 4 - 2 minutes
- Year 5 and 6 - 3 minutes

• Equipment

- Students may create a relevant PowerPoint that supports their presentation
- Appropriate props can be used to enhance audience interest

• Palm Cards

- Please encourage the use of small palm cards for all students
- Show your child/ren how to put text into dot points

• Topic Selection

- This is best to be students' own choice, but you may guide them if they are amenable
- Make sure your child/ren tell their teacher their topic before they begin their research to make sure the topic is appropriate for a school based audience

Dear Parents,

Following our recent school photography by Kapture, you can now view and order any special photos taken this year.

When visiting <https://www.kapture.com.au/event.asp> you will need to enter our school code under the **Sports & Event tab** to access the gallery: **PCPKV3**

The school photo orders were sent home with your child yesterday. Please note the following:

- Magnetic photo frames and additional prints are slotted between the prints of your package.
- Key chains are packed separately and distributed by the school office to the classroom teachers, who then distribute to the students. Check with your teacher if you have not received yours as yet.
- Sibling photos (if applicable to your school) are delivered to the eldest child and placed inside their photo package as additional prints if applicable.
- Digital negative orders will be sent to your email address supplied within 3-5 days of the school photo delivery. Don't forget to check your junk mail folders.
- You are still able to place additional orders via the Kapture website including orders for sports, music or special group photos taken on school photo day. Use the same school code as previously supplied.

If you ordered photos more than 10 days after photo day, your order will be handled separately and mailed directly to your home address within the next 28 days. Check your confirmation email for more information.
