Some of our Year 3-6 students participated in a National Online internet safety webinar on Tuesday 6 September 2022.


Hosted by the Office of eSafety Commissioner, the webinar was designed to be an interactive and engaging opportunity for our students to:


#### **Tuart Tech - Osmos in Year 3!**
