School Development Days

Schools are granted pupil-free days each year to support whole school staff development, implementation, review and replanning of strategic directions and curriculum support.

There is one School Development day left in 2022 – on **Friday 16 December 2022** all rostered educators will attend school but students will not.

The Department of Education has granted six School Development Days for 2023.

Following a presentation from the Administration Team, these dates have been approved by the School Board:

- Monday 30 January 2023 Pupil free all rostered educators will attend school but students will not.
- Tuesday 31 January 2023 Pupil free all rostered educators will attend school but students will not.
- School starts for students on Wednesday 1 February 2023
- Friday 2 June 2023 creates a four-day longer weekend for THPS families on the Labour Day Long weekend
- Friday 18 August 2023 creates a three-day long weekend for THPS families in the middle of Term Three
- Friday 10 November 2023 creates a three-day long weekend for THPS families in the middle of Term Four
- Friday 15 December 2023 the last day of Term Four

Our Staff collaborate with Curriculum Leaders and the Admin Team to set rich agendas for School Development Days that result in stronger Curriculum knowledge, increased efficacy in teaching craft and consistent assessment progressions while building stronger morale, effective mentoring and better team processes.




AFL Football by Lilah




