Bunuru - Second summer - February - March



The hottest time of the year, Bunuru is a season of little to no rain and hot easterly winds with a cooling sea breeze in the afternoon if you are along the coast. The weather during this time permitted Noongar people to live and fish along the coast, rivers and estuaries and their diet consisted mainly of freshwater and sea foods.

White flowers, especially flowering gums including Jarrah, Marri and Ghost Gums are in full bloom. The female Zamia (Macrozamia Riedle) is also notable due to being much larger than its male counterpart, with huge cones emerging from the centre of the plant with masses of a cotton wool like substance. As the weather continues to be dry and hot, the Zamia seed upon the cone changes from green to bright red, indicating they are ripening and becoming more attractive to animals, particularly the emu, that will eat the toxic fleshy outer part of the plant.

School Dress Code

At Tuart Hill Primary School all students are expected to wear our school uniform. This assists students in developing a positive self-image, encourages the development of pride in our school and provides a positive image to the local community.

Dress Code Requirements

- Red Sun safe Hat
- Red school shirts or polo shirts /T-shirts (collar preferred). No slogans or multi-coloured designs.
- School jumpers /zip tops (with school logo), or red windcheaters.
- Black trousers, tracksuit pants
- Black shorts/skirts/skorts
- School dress/red and white check cotton dress
- Appropriate footwear closed in shoes eg: joggers, soft soled shoes or school shoes.
- Plain black socks are encouraged.
- Stud or small sleeper earrings only
- Leggings/bike shorts are not pants. Students may wear **black** leggings/tights/bike shorts **underneath** dresses, skirts, shorts or skorts for warmth, modesty, comfort and cultural reasons.
- Denim clothing, flip-flop footwear, ugg boots, wellingtons, high heels or party wear is not permitted for classroom activities. Parents may be called to provide an appropriate change of clothing/footwear and will be asked to supervise their child/ren to change.
- Makeup of any kind is not permitted and nail polish is strongly discouraged (clear protective polish might be ignored). Parents may be called to help their child remove it.
- Accessorised headbands and large decorative hairbows should be saved for home wear. Students will be asked to pop such items into their bags so that they can wear their school hats.

Modifications to the Dress Code



Parents who, for religious or health reasons, may wish to modify the school dress code are required to make an appointment with the principal. Staff will be informed of any student granted a modification to the dress code.

Sanctions

Students not following the dress code will receive:

- counselling from a deputy principal on the benefits of a dress code
- assistance/support in obtaining suitable clothing, if necessary; and
- a pass for an agreed length of time for dress modification.

Students not following the dress code may be denied the opportunity to represent their school at school activities, which include choir, excursions, sporting and social events.
