Bunuru - Second summer - February - March The hottest time of the year, Bunuru is a season of little to no rain and hot easterly winds with a cooling sea breeze in the afternoon if you are along the coast. The weather during this time permitted Noongar people to live and fish along the coast, rivers and estuaries and their diet consisted mainly of freshwater and sea foods. White flowers, especially flowering gums including Jarrah, Marri and Ghost Gums are in full bloom. The					
Artwork by Darryl Bellotti female Zamia (Macrozamia Riedle) is also notable due to being much larger than its male counterpart, with huge cones emerging from the centre of the plant with masses of a cotton wool like substance. As the weather continues to be dry and hot, the Zamia seed upon the cone changes from green to bright red, indicating they are ripening and becoming more attractive to animals, particularly the emu, that will eat the toxic fleshy outer part of the plant.

Dear Parents and Carers,

Before and After School Expectations

I am pleased to clarify the school's expectations around the start and the end of the school day.

BEFORE SCHOOL

<u>All</u> students who arrive at school before 8.30 am must be escorted to the Garden area close to the Office where they are required to stay quietly respectfully seated until Admin permit play.

The School does not formally accept duty of care for students until 8.15 am. Students should **NOT** be dropped at school **before 8.15 am**. Parents of students who persistently arrive outrageously early, such as before 8.00am may expect a phone call and a request to access OSH care. Parents of students who behave poorly before school may expect a phone call and a request that they stay to supervise their child. School staff have work to complete before face-to-face class time and should not need to babysit nor discipline students who are too early on the school grounds.

Kindy and Pre-Primary students need to be passed directly into educator care by a parent or a person over 18 and approved by the parent. Therefore, Kindy and Pre-Primary students who arrive at school before 8.30 am must have a parent/responsible, approved adult stay with them in the Garden or on the Oval until 8.30 am THEN make their way to the classrooms. Year One parents make a judgement themselves as to whether their child needs morning drop-off support, but students Year One to Six may be left at 8.15 am for us to supervise and support.

At **8.15** am the Administration Staff supervise all students who are at school in the Garden and on the Senior Oval, by Lawley Street. Students may play chess, chat with friend, read their book, draw... in the Garden or take sports equipment onto the Oval for a play. The Hard Courts and the Dental Centre are out of bounds before school.

All other play areas are NOT TO BE USED before school. If you are at school before 8.30 am – when the teachers open their doors to welcome student and support them to prepare for the school day – you need to make you way to the Garden and Senior Oval area. Bring your Kindy and Pre-primary and Year ones to the Garden and the Oval please. You can wait for 8.30 am there with them.

Do not hover outside the classrooms. Give the educators a few more minutes of prep time please.

Do not play on the playgrounds before school. Students have plenty of time during the school day to play on the playgrounds – they do not need more time before school. it is disruptive to the educators, especially the Phys Ed teacher and Kindy / Pre Primary educators putting out special items for planned outdoor learning as they prepare for the day's lessons.

Students will not be allowed to race around the Dental Centre at any time. This includes Recess and Lunch play. Our students are expected to respect the Dentists and Dental Therapists as they treat clients.

The Canteen opens for lunch orders at 8.30 am.

Teachers open their doors at 8.30 am to welcome you and their students. The ten minutes transition time encourages students take responsibility for preparing themselves and to transition from home to school positively. Every classroom has a morning routine designed to help set the students up for learning. Please kiss and run whenever possible. Your children are safe in our care – we work with you to help them develop their self-confidence and resilience.

Please talk to me directly to discuss any aspect of before school drop-off that is unclear or that does not work for your family. I am happy to chat and love to hear improvements suggestions.

AFTER SCHOOL

ALL students are expected to leave the school grounds promptly after the final 2.50 am siren.

Teachers supervise students at the class door/down the corridor/ off the verandahs but then students are deemed to be in their parents' care. School staff have work to complete, meetings to attend, appointments to keep after face-to-face class time and should not need to babysit nor discipline students who are on the school grounds after 2.50 pm.

Play areas are NOT TO BE USED after school. Students have plenty of time during the school day to play on the school equipment. The school play areas are not suitable for impromptu play dates. Please wander up to Grenville Park or arrange to meet in a different play space close to your respective homes. The school does not accept responsibility for student accidents not behaviour once we have passed duty of care to you. Time and again children are observed using play equipment that is not designed for their age group — therefore patently not safe. Children are using play equipment in ways not acceptable during the school day. School staff should not feel the need to solve afterschool behaviour issues.

Students who are supposed to be walking home or waiting at *kiss n drive* often join others playing. I should not be expected to chase students up who have been lured into an afterschool playdate when they have agreed with their parents that they will follow a certain responsible after-school procedure. I have a thousand after-school responsibilities. **Please gather your children and GO HOME** and do not allow other children to randomly join your family. It's nice that you are making good social connections, but the parents of those random children have told them that they are to GO HOME, so you 'looking after' them supports them to disobey their parents' instructions. Let's help our children develop into responsible, trustworthy members of our community.

The onsite OSH Care have sole use of the Junior and KPP play spaces after the final siren as part of their Lease payment. The OSH Care need these spaces to provide after school activities for the students in their care, and parents pay for and expect the highest standard of care. The OSH Care Educators find they either can't use areas they have planned to use because families will not leave, or that students in their charge are distracted by families who are still in the contracted space. This is the reason why the siren sounds at 3.15 pm. The 3.15 siren is a loud signal that OSH Care have provided afternoon tea for their charges and are now coming out for supervised planned play. It is the signal that the school gates are about to be locked for student security. Please make sure you leave school grounds promptly.

Students are expected to make their way home immediately after school. *Kiss n drive* is supervised every afternoon and it is very helpful if you encourage your child to rush out to meet me to help keep the traffic moving.

Students are strongly discouraged from loitering around local streets. Reports of poor behaviour or outrageous language by students clearly identified as attending Tuart Hill Primary School will result in parents being contacted, potential loss of Good Standing and possibly arrangements being made for those students to be passed directly from school care into your care at the 2.50 pm siren.

It is important parents know where their children are after school. Acorn Lane and the Wanneroo Road shops are not safe places for unaccompanied children. Grenville Park gatherings should be supervised. Certain phone apps should not be downloaded onto student phones.

Please talk to me directly to discuss any aspect of after school collection that is unclear or that does not work for your family. I am happy to chat and love to hear improvements suggestions.

- Keeping hats and jackets in school bags.



Our School Gates

Tuart Hill Primary School fences were erected during 2015, following repeated instances of unwanted and dangerous object being discarded across the school grounds and an increase in strangers wandering onto the campus. The fence has been impressive for supporting student safety. We rarely find debris on our grounds and have successfully limited times unwanted visitors have accessed our grounds.

Gates were included around the fences to support access to the school. This diagram is an attempt to explain opening and closing times for the gates.



Some points to note might be:

- Students must not access or exit the school through staff car parks and parents should not traverse through car parks with their children. The increase in the traffic around our school is reflected in our staff too, and many a close call has occurred in our staff car parks. Lets avoid heart attacks all around...
- Student and parent access gates on Lawley Street are clearly signed.
- The gate on Acorn Lane is now permanently locked due to a recent rapid increase in unwanted visitors to
 our school grounds from the Wanneroo Road Shops late in 2022. I apologize for the inconvenience this may
 cause, but student safety cannot be compromised.

The best student access and egress is expected to be:

- Banksia Street:
 - o The wide path through the Front Office
 - The narrow path that takes you to the steps outside Room 10
 - The double gates that allow close access to the Kindy buildings

• Cape Street:

- The gate at the bottom of the wide all-access path this should remain closed for ongoing safety of our youngest students and parents can lift up the Pool Latch for access and egress.
- The gate at the bottom of the path in the Junior Play space closest to the swing and the nature play area

<u>Lawley Street:</u>

- o The gate by the corner of Banksia Street and Lawley Street
- o The gate to the west of the Staff Car Park
- The gate that opens onto the hard courts.
