Djeran - Autumn – April - May							



Djeran season sees a break in the very hot weather, and the change in the season is evident in the wind with seeds, dust and leaves blown across the landscape. Flying ants can be seen cruising around in the light southerly winds of Djeran. You'll also notice this season brings cooler nights with a dewy presence for us to discover in the early mornings. This season sees red wildflowers take bloom, especially the Red Flowering Gum (Corimbia Ficifolia) and the petite Summer Flame (Beaufortia Aestiva). The male and female Sheoaks (Allocasuarina Fraseriana) form cones and Banksia start to

display their flowers ensuring there are nectar food sources for the many small mammals and birds that rely upon them.

From the Principals Desk

Kaya to our school community,

Week Three at Tuart Hill Primary has been a very busy week for our students and our teachers! Our junior students have celebrated their successes at our assembly, our early childhood students have pampered their Mums and significant loved ones for Mother's Day, selected Year Six students completed National Science Testing and our P and C provided some wonderful gifts for our students to purchase for Mother's Day.

National Science Testing

Our school was selected to participate in the National Science Literacy Assessments. This week, twenty Year 6 students were selected at random to complete the online assessment. The National Assessment Program – Science Literacy is an online test that informs schools, education ministers and the community about the levels of achievement in science literacy among Year 6 and Year 10 students across Australia, with the aim of improving teaching and learning. Science literacy is essential to students being able to interpret information on scientific issues, ask questions, conduct investigations, make decisions, communicate their findings and develop problem solving skills. This was an excellent learning opportunity for selected students, and we look forward to receiving our school results later in the year.

Before and after school play

We are experiencing an increase in students arriving at school before 8:00am. Students are not expected to be at school before 8:15am. All students from Kindergarten to Year Six who arrive between 8:15am and 8:30am are required to wait in the kitchen garden area, and if the weather is inclement, students wait in the hall area, under the supervision of the duty teacher. Play equipment is not to be used before school. Students are dismissed from school at 2:50pm and are encouraged to leave school grounds. There are a number of before and after school care services available to parents – please contact the front office for information regarding this if required.

Staff Professional Learning

This week our teachers met with colleagues from school in our network to moderate student writing samples. Moderation activities help ensure the comparability of school marks and grades between schools. This helps to ensure fairness of marking and grading for students and maintains the credibility of school marks and grades. We are very proud of our teachers at Tuart Hill and I'd like to take this opportunity to thank all our staff for their commitment to teaching and education excellence.

Science Room Update

There was plenty of excitement this week as our purpose built science room was officially opened for learning! Ms Cheeseman is adding her final touches to the room, which caters for both theory and practical learning spaces, as well as additional bench areas and wall space for displaying student work. Our school is thrilled with the latest learning environment and we look forward to watching our budding young Scientists explore and grow in their Science learning. Our Oral Language classes are now being delivered from the former Science room and Ms Caldwell has transformed this area to support our students' engagement and interaction in Oral Languages.

Equipment Updates

Our Early Childhood Centre continues to grow with student enrolments and thanks to a \$5000 donation from our amazing P and C, will receive some new educational equipment to support our youngest students' engagement opportunities both in and out of the classroom. The purchase of new equipment will continue to support the development of fine motor skills, STEM principles and cooperative play and learning skills. Thank you for participating in our school P and C fundraising events, which have contributed to the purchase of these items.
