Makuru Winter | June and July

The coldest and wettest time of the year, Makuru was traditionally the time that Noongar people moved back inland and away from the coast. Winds turn to the west and south bringing rain and occasional snow on the peaks of the Stirling and Porongurup Ranges. During this season, waterways and catchments begin to fill and Noongar people change

their diet from eating food from the sea and lakes to hunting grazing animals such as the kangaroo (Yongar).

Makuru is also a time for animals to begin pairing up in preparation for breeding in the coming season. Blue and purple

flowers such as Blueberry Lilly (Dianella Revoluta) and the Purple Flags (Patersonia Occidentalis) emerge during these colder months, and as Makuru draws to a close. You will notice the white flowers of the weeping peppermint (Agonis Flexuosa) as the blues start to make way for the white and cream flowers of Djilba.


