

A Diabolo is a plastic spinning top in the shape of an hourglass that is used with thick strings and handles on each side. The performance was fantastic, as they were able to throw the spinning top all the way across the hall where another person would catch it and did all sorts of other tricks.

After the performance we were all extremely excited to start learning how to do it ourselves. Some of us were right on to it and got the tricks straight away but others were dropping it all over the


place.

Our school is honoured to be part of the Story Dog program as many of our students are benefitting each week through our involvement.



#### Values Card Lucky Dip Winners Monday 4 September 2023


