Jjurpin Kaa Kaa, Happy Kookaburra was presented to the Year Three classes by Lieshia Green, Aboriginal Education Officer based at Osborne Primary School on Wednesday 11 October 2023. This incursion is an interactive teaching tool to share Aboriginal History of Australia.

The presentation included an explanation to the connection to country, Aboriginal people on the lands, a brief explanation of an Acknowledgement / Welcome to Country and concluded with students exploring Noongar Language (Animal Names) and an engaging Dreamtime story activity using the Rainbow Bird book and Australian animal puppets.

A huge thanks to parents and families who came to help start the botanical mural on the second week of holidays. Also to the P&C assisting with generous funding for the paint. Your help was very much appreciated and meant the wall could be completed before kids arrived back for Term 4.

The work features only drawings from Year 2 and Year 3 students, based on plants and birds the kids see in their local area and on school grounds.

The kids' drawings were reduced in size, then traced onto a clear sheet. This was then projected onto the wall. The tracings at night took 7 hours.

The painting took over 50 hours. The paints are from Melbourne and are specific mural paints. The wall is 4m x 10m and required scaffolding to reach the higher areas.

Thanks to **past parent Nic Mortimer**, who kindly came out and assisted me with extra ladders and scaffolding help. Here are photos that show the journey.




