Even the Balgas will flowers, especially if they have been burnt in the past year. One of the most striking displays of flowers at this time of year is the Mooja or Australian Christmas Tree, where its bright orange/yellow flowers signal that heat is on its way. As many things are undergoing transformation with the warm change in the weather and longer dry periods, October is a time of the year you are most likely to encounter a snake. Reptiles at this time are emerging from hibernation and look to make the most of the warm weather to assist them in getting enough energy to look for food.

2024 School Development Days

Schools are granted pupil-free days each year to support whole school staff development, implementation, review and replanning of strategic directions and curriculum support.

There is one School Development day left in 2022 – on **Friday 15 December 2023** all rostered educators will attend school but students will not.

The Department of Education has granted six School Development Days for 2024. Following a presentation from the Administration Team, these dates have been approved by the School Board:

- Monday 30 January 2024 Pupil free all rostered educators will attend school but students will not.
- Tuesday 31 January 2024 Pupil free all rostered educators will attend school but students will not.
- School starts for students on Wednesday 31 January 2024
- Friday 26 April 2024 follows the ANZAC Day Public Holiday Thursday 25 April 2024 to create a four-day longer weekend for THPS families during Term Two.
- Friday 16 August 2024 creates a three-day long weekend for THPS families in the middle of Term Three
- Friday 8 November 2024 creates a three-day long weekend for THPS families in the middle of Term Four
- Friday 13 December 2024 the last day of Term Four

Our Staff collaborate with Curriculum Leaders and the Admin Team to set rich agendas for School Development Days that result in stronger Curriculum knowledge, increased efficacy in teaching craft and consistent assessment progressions while building stronger morale, effective mentoring and better team processes.

2023 Semester Two Student Summative Reports



Staff are continuing to present lessons designed to support students to demonstrate their knowledge and skills so that they demonstrate expected learning outcomes across the <u>https://parent.scsa.wa.edu.au/</u>Western Australian Curriculum. Teachers use their <u>professional judgement</u> to synthesise demonstrations of individual student progress and achievement into grades, where a 'C' grade is 'as expected' or 'satisfactory'.

I encourage parents and carers to take the time to 'check in' with class teachers to make sure you know:

- how your child/ren are going,
- that you have the opportunity to see work samples, and
- ask your teacher for their professional judgement as to whether, based on current information, your child's progress is 'good enough'.

From these queries flows comments around:

- what you can expect to happen at school, and
- how you can support your child at home.

The best way to make a time with your child/ren's teacher for a check in is to email them via their professional email and arrange a mutually convenient face to face appointment time. Swoop Smart Magpie Awareness

As the days warm up in Djilba, you'll start to see and hear the first newborn birds alongside their proudly protective parents providing food, teaching new skills and keeping them safe from other animals, including humans. Magpies (Koolbardi), Willy Wag Tails (Djidi Djidi) and Wattle Birds (Chuck-a-luck) are among the few birds that fiercely protect their nests, hence the swooping behaviour.

We currently have a few very protective Magpies in our wonderful School Trees; we wear our hats and give the families some space. For more information about swooping behaviour, please visit <u>the website</u>. To report a swooping incident within the City of Stirling, phone (08) 9205 8555.



The following tips will help you stay safe and reduce the impact of a swooping magpie

- Look out for any caution signage placed in our parks and reserves, stay clear of nesting sites and plan alternative routes
- Do not provoke magpies as they swoop to protect their young
- · Wear sunglasses, a wide brimmed hat (especially kids) or carry an umbrella
- Travel in groups if possible as the birds often target individuals
- If you are riding a bike, dismount and walk through nesting magpie territory
- If you are swooped by a magpie, stay calm, walk away but do not run, and avoid looking towards the swooping birds.

- Keeping hats and jackets in school bags.






Values Card Lucky Dip Winners Monday 16 October 2023


P and C News

Late Orders _____ The cut-off time for all lunch orders is 9.00am. Orders placed after this time will have limited choice available. Thank you for your understanding.


Please note: We do not offer credit on lunches or other items. We cannot give change for \$50 notes, please have correct change for lunch orders and small tender for counter purchases.
