# Year Six Incursion

This week our Year 6 students were incredibly lucky to have participated in workshops led by Aboriginal Support Workers Renata and Charmaine. Titled Koora Waangkininy Boodjar'- a long time ago talking on Country, these workshops form part of



Tuart Hill's Aboriginal History Journey. The presentation has been developed by Charmaine and made to suit Aboriginal and non-Aboriginal people of Australia, particularly Western Australia, to be emerged into an interactive learning experience that explores the history of our Aboriginal peoples.

The journey experience begins with rugs arranged on the floor to represent Australia before the arrival of European people and takes participants on an immersive exploration of the nation-to-nation relationship with Aboriginal people, working towards reconciliation and empowering people to build bridges of understanding and respect. This experience is a teaching tool to share the historical and contemporary relationships between Aboriginal and non-Aboriginal people of Australia. The activity assists with increasing the capacity of Teachers to use their knowledge of the History, Culture, Languages and experiences of Aboriginal people to use in classroom practice.
