#### **Culture Classes**

This week we were very proud to host our first Cultural Class for First Nations students at our school. Lieshia Green, Aboriginal and Islander Education Officer from Osborne Primary School, and Tegan Green, Education Assistant at Tuart Hill Primary School, began the class with a Yarning circle, where Lieshia led the students in activities which included learning some Noongar vocabulary for some local animals. Our students listened to a story read in the Noongar language, and Lieshia shared with the group information about different Aboriginal Cultures in Australia. Students had the opportunity to hold some Aboriginal artifacts, learning what they were traditionally used for, and the class concluded with a lovely, shared afternoon tea, where conversations continued about Culture and the students eagerly asking when the next class would be. We are proud to celebrate all cultures at Tuart Hill PS and look forward to a continued partnership with Lieshia and Tegan.



















#### School Arrival and Leaving Times

Teachers at Tuart Hill Primary School accept duty of care for their students at 8.30 am. **Students are not to be dropped at school any earlier than 8.15 am**. Parents must make appropriate before school care arrangements with childcare centres or family friends if children need to be at school prior to this time. **Students who arrive at school between 8.15 am and 8.30 am must attend the Kitchen garden area, where they will be supervised by a member of the Administration Staff.** Students are to be collected promptly at the end of the school day – 2.50 pm. Children who have not been collected within 10 minutes of the 2.50 final siren will be required to wait in the front office from where they will be handed over to their parent or carer, and the pickup time recorded. It is expected that this would only occur when parents have been unavoidably detained. make links with each other and are pleased that families may linger for a few social minutes after school. In such circumstances, parents hold duty of care for their children. All people are expected to observe our School Expectations. The Siren will sound at 3.15 pm to alert parents that the school perimeter gates are about to be locked –usually at 3.30 pm.

The school gates are locked from 8:50am. Please exit the school via the admin area if you are still on school grounds after this time.

#### Harmony Day Parade

Our school is celebrating **Harmony Day on Monday the 25th of March.** Harmony Day is time for us to celebrate and appreciate all the diverse backgrounds in our school and across Australia. I encourage you, where possible, to celebrate this with us by dressing your child in traditional cultural dress that reflects your own cultures. Dressing in the colour **orange** is also encouraged to show your support of Harmony Day should you not have traditional dress. As this parade will occur first thing in the morning, you are more than welcome to bring a change of uniform for your child as they will be engaging in usual routines for the rest of the school day.
