Congratulations to our amazing Junior students for receiving a merit award at this week's assembly.

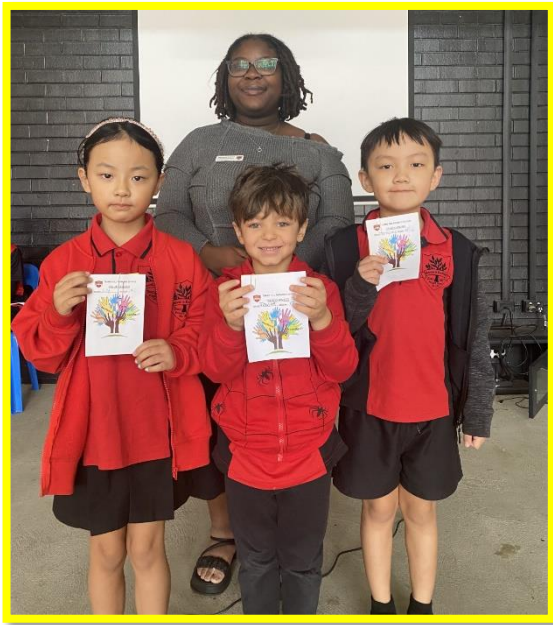


Congratulations to Room 10 – our Golden Broom winners for Week 6!


