

Our school is celebrating NAIDOC this week. NAIDOC Week, which first began in 1975, provides an opportunity for all Australians to learn about First Nations cultures and histories and participate in celebrations of the oldest, continuous living cultures on earth.



The 2024 theme is "Keep the fire burning! Blak, loud and proud" and honours the enduring strength and vitality of First Nations culture – with fire a symbol of connection to Country, to each other, and to the rich tapestry of traditions that define Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples.

in Northam and shared some of his family stories with us, with the take home message for us all that 'our lives are a journey; we need to travel slow and travel safe'. During the week, our students were led by Miss Tegan Green and Miss Leishia Green, as we explored lessons in First Nations Culture. 

Throughout the week, teachers held lessons in the classroom, to deepen our understanding of the longest continuous culture in the world. On Thursday and Friday, we had Tegan Green and Lieshia Green, two Noongar ladies passionate about education, their culture and language, run various hands-on activities across all year groups, with help from our Indigenous year six students.

We are proud to keep the fire burning and hope students have come home and shared their experiences with you.

The Perth Basketball Association (Perth Redbacks) has recently launched an ambitious campaign. It petitions the State Government for the land and resources needed to build a new 12-

court sporting and mixed-use stadium for Perth.

The indoor courts situation in Perth is critical, leading to long wait lists for joining clubs, especially for basketball. Too many kids and families are missing out, and we need more courts in Perth to increase access and participation. For the Redbacks, this campaign is also about securing a home for the club for the first time in 60 years.

The campaign aims to reach 10,000 signatories on the petition, sending a compelling message to the government before the next election. Supporting the campaign is easy.
