Sharing Culture



Alan, a Year 6 student, is a proud young Noongar man, who was born on Noongar Boodjar country (Perth metropolitan area land). Alan has been learning to play the didgeridoo for a short time now, with his Uncle teaching him the many sounds and representations he can make on the instrument. Alan's favourite sound to make is the kookaburra – he says he likes the sound it makes as it comes through the instrument. The trickiest sound for Alan to make is also the kookaburra because he needs to focus on circular breathing for a long time. The paintings on Alan's didgeridoo represent stories about being on Country and exploring nature. Alan's class were lucky enough to have Alan play his didgeridoo to them, sparking some insightful conversations amongst some of our Year 6 students about Alan's culture.



Kyren is a Pre-Primary student and has been a member of Koolanganka's Kreate dance group since he was 2 years old. Kyren is a proud Nyoongar, Yamatji, Gija and Wangkatha (Mothers connection), and Arnernte and Warlpiri (Fathers connection) boy who loves to share his cultural knowledge with his classmates. This week Kyren bought his didgeridoo to music class, where he demonstrated to his class and teachers some sounds that he has been learning to create. Kyren's favourite sound to make is the dingo, but he finds making Eagle noises very tricky. Kyren also shared with the class some Dreaming stories, including the scary Bunyip who grabbed the little children when they didn't listen to what their parents told them to do!

Every staff member at this school is committed to collaboration, to care and to continually improve their practice and curriculum knowledge. It is a privilege to work along side them, and you, to support your children to make progress and achieve to their potential.
