Kambarang (October – November). The Noongar Season 'Kambarang' is represented by the colour yellow as it symbolises the return of the hot weather. During Kambarang season, we see an abundance of colours and flowers exploding all around us. The yellows of many of the acacias continue to abound, along with some of the banksias and many other smaller delicate flowering plants including the kangaroo paw and orchids. During this time the balgas will continue to flower, especially if they've been burnt in the past year or closely shaved. One of the most striking displays of flowers to be seen during this season will be the moojar, or Australian Christmas Tree (Nuytsia floribunda). The bright orange-yellow flowers serve to signal the heat is on its way. October is also the most likely time of the year that you'll encounter a snake as the reptiles start to awaken from their hibernation and look to make the most of the warm to assist them in getting enough energy to look for food. It's also a time that many young families of birds will be singing out for their parents to feed them. Koolbardies (magpies) will be out protecting their nests and their babies. Many things are undergoing transformation with the warm change in the weather and longer dry periods accompany a definite warming trend.

From the Principal's Desk

Noongar Word of the Week

To continue our culturally responsive practice, our school has introduced a Noongar Word of the Week. Each week students will be introduced to the word in their daily morning circles, as well as at assemblies and in the Tuart Times. This week's Noongar word is: DJITI DJITI. The English word for DJITI DJITI is the Willy Wag Tail, and our school is very lucky to have lots of these birds on our school grounds. Mrs Del Grossi's Kindergarten Class is also named after this bird.

Students and Families must leave School Grounds promptly after 2:50 pm

I am sorry to share that **another accident occurred** in our playgrounds yesterday after school.

Parents, please LEAVE the school grounds with your children at the end of the school day.

Students who are meant to walk home MUST leave and go directly home.

Our staff remind our students they must wear helmets if they ride, scoot or skate to school; please reinforce this safety requirement with your older, independent children. Thank you.

Please move off the school grounds to a nearby public park for a happy after-school play with other families.

Outside of School Care hire our grounds from 2:50 pm and need to maintain a safe environment for their enrolled children.

Some clubs coordinate supervised after-school activities for enrolled students.

Keeping enrolled students safe and actively engaged in pre-arranged events is increasingly difficult as families are staying and playing at school. Currently, many children are playing unsafely. The equipment is not designed for all ages to exploit, and due care is not being taken, along with school expectations blatantly ignored.

Teachers and Administration Staff have other commitments after school. We can not be relied upon to be available to administer First Aid, to phone for ambulances, if necessary, to phone for parents as often parents are not on site.

Parents, please LEAVE the school grounds with your children at the end of the school day. Students who are meant to walk home MUST leave and go directly home.

Before school every day

I remind parents that teachers open their doors to accept duty of care at 8:30am.

Increasingly parents are allowing their children to play in the Kindy/Pre-Primary playground and outside Kindy Room 20 / Room 17 before school. Some children run wildly around classroom and sheds. We are not able to set up movement challenges before school because our Obstacle Courses are used unsafely and often destroyed. **This is very disruptive** to the educators working in the nearby classrooms.

We love to have you at school in good time; we love that parents have a few minutes to chat and build relationships **and** the area where we ask families to **wait with your children is the Garden and the Senior Oval** (by Lawley Street).

Students sit and chat until 8:15 am; the Associate Principals then supervise all our student as they enjoy active play on the oval and the Garden Playground. Please do not hover all over the school grounds. Your teachers are conscientiously doing morning preparation for the day; please respect their professionalism.

Please also remind others in our school community of this request. Students who arrive at school prior to 8:30am MUST go to the Garden. Parents and siblings of Kindy, Pre-Primary and our Year One students need to go with them too. Please do not play on the equipment nor around the classrooms; thank you.

If you are at school before 8:30am, wait with your children is the Garden and the Senior Oval (by Lawley Street).

Please work with us to follow these requests. Our teachers work hard and deserve time to be well-prepared. Our students are valuable; our first priority is their physical and social safety. Please let us help you keep everyone safe before and after school.

My door is always open; please come and chat to me directly regarding this directive, as we will be immediately reinforcing the above expectations with our students and you, our parents. Thank you.

Before School

Please go to the Garden and Senior Oval with your child.

Teachers open classroom doors at 8:30am.

Please respect their professional preparation time.

Thank you.

After school

Teachers pass duty of care to you at 2:50pm; perimeter gates are closed at 3:00pm.

Please make your way off school premises promptly.

Outside of School Hours Care hire our school grounds from 2:50pm to provide safe, caring supervision for enrolled students.

Some **Clubs coordinate supervised activities** for enrolled students. Please vacate our grounds to allow these pre-arranged events to occur.






Talk Off 2024




2025 School Planning and Class Placement Requests

2024 Semester Two Student Summative Reports



Staff are continuing to present lessons designed to support students to demonstrate their knowledge and skills so that they demonstrate expected learning outcomes across the https://parent.scsa.wa.edu.au/ Western Australian Curriculum. Teachers use their professional judgement to synthesise demonstrations of individual student progress and achievement into grades, where a 'C' grade is 'as expected' or 'satisfactory'.



I encourage parents and carers to take the time to 'check in' with class teachers to make sure you know:

- how your child/ren are going,
- that you have the opportunity to see work samples, and
- ask your teacher for their professional judgement as to whether, based on current information, your child's progress is 'good enough'.
