Bunuru (February - March) The Noongar Season 'Bunuru' is represented by the colour orange and is the hottest time of the year. Bunuru is the hottest time of the year with little to no rain. Hot easterly winds continue with a cooling sea breeze most afternoons – if you're close to the coast. Traditionally this was, and still is, a great time for living and fishing by the coast, rivers and estuaries. Because of this, freshwater foods and seafood made up major parts of the Noongar people's diet during Bunuru. Bunuru is also a time of the white flowers with lots of white flowering gums in full bloom, including jarrah, marri and ghost gums. Another striking flower to look out for is the female zamia (Macrozamia riedlei). Being much larger than its male counterpart, the huge cones emerge from the centre of the plant with masses of a cotton wool like substance. As the hot and dry weather continues, the seed cones change from green to bright red, indicating they're ripening and becoming more attractive to animals, particularly the emu, that will eat the toxic fleshy outer layer. Staff worked together during our School Development Days Monday 3 and Tuesday 4 February, reaffirming our whole school directions and consolidating essential knowledge. Thank you to our Presenters who kept us engaged, and thank you, educators, for your commitment to our students and families.





Our community can be extraordinarily proud of the educators who work at Tuart Hill Primary School. Families can expect that all classes are guided by expert educators who care deeply for the positive welfare of the students in their charge and who will work closely with you to give your child/ren every opportunity to make progress and to achieve to the best of their abilities. Our school is a great school, made so by our excellent staff – and enhanced by our partnerships with you all.

School Grounds Update

We took delivery of one more new transportable building, which was installed over the school break, adding to our Year Six student hub. We have also had a team of contractors replace the eaves across the front of the school facing the Staff Car park, all of our evaporative air conditioners have been serviced in preparation for the start of the school year and we have improved the safety around steps and uneven surfaces by highlighting edges and placing non-slip panels where needed. We are anticipating installation of extra shade sails during Term One, as providing shade for our students as they play and learn is a shared priority at all levels of our school community.

Play, Eat, Learn

Following the successful trial of 'flipping' times for recess and lunch throughout 2024, our students will continue to have their lunch play break at 11:10am, where they will enjoy active playing the playground. At 11:30am, students will come in from play and eat their lunch, before returning to class at 11:50am. Between 1:30pm – 1:50pm, students enjoy an afternoon recess break in the playground.

Our school has found Play Eat Learn routines very successful, with benefits including:

- students being settled down and ready to learn when they return to the classroom.
- less fights and disagreements on the playground and better classroom behaviour
- students are not rushing through lunch, nor neglecting their food so as to get to play quicker
- students are hungrier when it's time for lunch, so they generally eat better.

We encourage students to eat a healthy snack (Crunch and Sip) as part of our morning classroom routines; please pack for your child a small serve of cut up fruit and/or vegetables, that can be eaten easily by your child as they continue their lessons. School Drop Off and Pick Up

Finding a parking spot for school drop-off and pick up is challenging for most Perth metropolitan schools.


Tuart Hill Primary School is fortunate to have a **Kiss & Drive** zone, which, if used correctly, significantly reduces the demand for parking spots around the school.

Our community demonstrates courtesy and patience. Our next step is to help each other to use the Kiss & Drive zone in a manner that encourages traffic flow.



When using the Kiss & Drive you need to:

- Drive to the furthest available space in the marked area
- Stop for 1 minute only
- Move on as soon as your child has exited or entered the vehicle
- Make sure your vehicle is not blocking the Disabled Parking Bay
- Circle the block and try again if no spots are available or the child you are collecting has not arrived



Thank you for observing all council regulations when using the Kiss and Drive so that school drop-offs and pick-ups are safe and stress-free for every member of our school community.








In My Children, you can see each child's classes and teachers (on the right side of the Overview screen). It is important to note that schools determine which information is available and not all sections will be visible to all parents.



Canteen

Lunchbox Hub is Locavora rebranded. The food is the same, but the website ordering experience is different. Lunchbox Hub has a phone app for placing orders. All food ordered is prepared off site at a local kitchen, clearly labelled and delivered to the school. Volunteers sort the lunches into lunch crates and Year 6 students deliver lunch crates to students at lunchtime.

Please note that the new system allows parents to place multiple orders into their online shopping cart. Each order is confirmed before it is added to the cart. You need to go through the checkout and pay. Once the order has been paid you will receive a confirmation email. Please thoroughly check your confirmation email. If you haven't received a confirmation email, your order wasn't completed. We hate seeing sad and hungry students at the canteen.
