

Bunuru (February - March) The Noongar Season 'Bunuru' is represented by the colour orange and is the hottest time of the year. Bunuru is the hottest time of the year with little to no rain. Hot easterly winds continue with a cooling sea breeze most afternoons – if you're close to the coast. Traditionally this was, and still is, a great time for living and fishing by the coast, rivers and estuaries. Because of this, freshwater foods and seafood made up major parts of the Noongar people's diet during Bunuru. Bunuru is also a time of the white flowers with lots of white flowering gums in full bloom, including jarrah, marri and ghost gums. Another striking flower to look out for is the female zamia (Macrozamia riedlei). Being much larger than its male counterpart, the huge cones emerge from the centre of the plant with masses of a cotton wool like substance. As the hot and dry weather continues, the seed cones change from green to bright red, indicating they're ripening and becoming more attractive to animals, particularly the emu, that will eat the toxic fleshy outer layer.

Ms Green hosted our indigenous students who yarned with the Stars after the Year Six Q and A session. We felt proud and honoured by this inspirational visit.


















Badged Student Leaders:

SCHOOL DROP-OFF AND PICK UP



Finding a parking spot for school drop-off and pick up is challenging for most Perth metropolitan schools. Tuart Hiil Primary School is fortunate to have a **Kiss & Drive** zone, which, if used correctly, significantly reduces the demand for parking spots around the school.

KISS & DRIVE

DRIVE THRU PICK UP

Our community can help each other to use the Kiss & Drive zone in a manner that encourages traffic flow.

When using the **Kiss & Drive** you need to:

- Drive to the furthest available space in the marked area
- Stop for <u>1 minute only.</u> Circle around and join the end of the queue to allow other parents to colect their children who are already waiting. Keep Kiss & Drive moving.
- Move on as soon as your child has exited or entered the vehicle. Buckle up quickly.
- Make sure your vehicle is not blocking the Disabled Parking Bay
- Circle the block and try again if no spots are available or the child you are collecting has not arrived. Never
 double-park.

lit is not ok for the driver to wait in the car whilst another adult enters the school to drop off or collect their child.

Asking your child to cross the road for you to pick up on residential verges is discouraged. Pick-up traffic is so busy and potentially unpredicatable - you are risking your child's life, and you give the rest of us anxiety attacks, if you beckon them across to you. Please join the queue and circle around to pick up on the correct side.

Thank you for observing all council regulations when using the Kiss and Drive so that school drop-offs and pick-ups are safe and stress-free for every member of our school community. While it may seem that Kiss & Drive is a malestrom of cars and students, it always clears in a few short minutes once the students flock out of class.

Thank you for your care and patience. Keep Kiss & Drive moving, slowly with courtesy. Use Riley Street and Lawley Street When entering Banksia Street to see if your child has made it out to Kiss & Drive.



Wait <u>one minute</u>, then MOVE ON around the round about, left at Riley Street and along Lawley Street and rejoin the Queue. By then, your child will be waiting for you. Scoop them up! This may help the queue move.

Canteen

The onsite school canteen will now be open on Tuesdays and Wednesdays. Fresh salads, sandwiches and rolls will be available each day plus daily specials. Icy treats including Froyos will be available for afternoon break (Year 1-6 students only. Tuesday and Wednesday only) Tuesday specials are burgers and Wednesday specials are chicken nuggets and chicken strips with salad. These are the summer menu items. Pizza's will be available again in winter. Birthday Buckets are also back on the menu. Online ordering only, no canteen counter sales for lunch orders. Students must collect afternoon break food like Froyos and popcorn from the canteen (Year 1-6 students only).

Lunchbox Hub Orders

Lunchbox Hub is Locavora rebranded. The food is the same, but the website ordering experience is different. Lunchbox Hub has a phone app for placing orders. All food ordered is prepared off site at a local kitchen, clearly labelled and delivered to the school. Volunteers sort the lunches into lunch crates and Year 6 students deliver lunch crates to students at lunchtime.

Please note that the new system allows parents to place multiple orders into their online shopping cart. Each order is confirmed before it is added to the cart. You need to go through the checkout and pay. Once the order has been paid you will receive a confirmation email. Please thoroughly check your confirmation email. If you haven't received a confirmation email, your order wasn't completed. We hate seeing sad and hungry students at the canteen.

Orders can be cancelled or rescheduled online before cutoff time on the delivery date. Check out the <u>schools</u> webpage for more details including a link to the user's guide.
