 <p>Djeran (April – May) The Noongar Season 'Djeran' is represented by the colour green as it is the time of the year where the cooler weather begins. Djeran season sees a break in the really hot weather. A key indicator of the change of season is the cool nights that bring a dewy presence in the early mornings. The winds will also change, especially in their intensity, with light breezes generally swinging from southerly directions. Many flying ants can be seen cruising around in the light winds. Djeran is a time of red flowers, especially from the red flowering gum (<i>Corymbia ficifolia</i>), as well as the smaller and more petite flowers of the summer flame (<i>Beaufortia aestiva</i>). Noongar Word of the Week



This term we will be learning to sing “Head, Shoulders, Knee and Toes’ in Noongar. We’re starting by learning the word to the song each week and this week, the Noongar word we are learning is **boornitj**. The English word for **boornitj** is *knees*.

RAC Road Safety Incursion

Every class benefited from Mrs Connolly’s organisation of the RAC Road Safety

presentation this week.

RAC provides free road safety education workshops and online resources for primary schools across Western Australia. Workshops and resources are available to suit each year group and cover a range of road safety topics designed to keep children safe around the roads.



Junior students practised Road Safety, including crossing the road and investigating safety of the road. Year Three students explored Bicycle Safety, Year Fours Seatbelts and Passenger Safety, Year Five students discussed avoiding risky behaviours and Year Six students learned about alternative sources of fuel then built a battery-powered car that included safety features.

The Year Sixes were fascinated as they tested their ‘cars’ outside the classrooms. This was an informative and engaging series of lessons.

We are Anaphylaxis Aware

This means:

- we are **aware** that some of our students may have allergic / anaphylactic reactions to a range of triggers;
- Therefore, we **avoid** bringing trigger foods onto the school grounds and
- We take **action** should any student, staff member, parent or volunteer experience symptoms of anaphylaxis.

Several students in our school are anaphylactic to nuts. As such, we ask that parents take care NOT to send any nuts or nut products to school.

- Keeping hats and jackets in school bags.

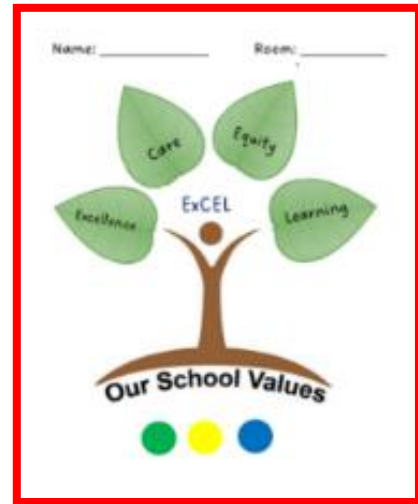


Congratulations Room 7 – Golden Broom Winners for this week!

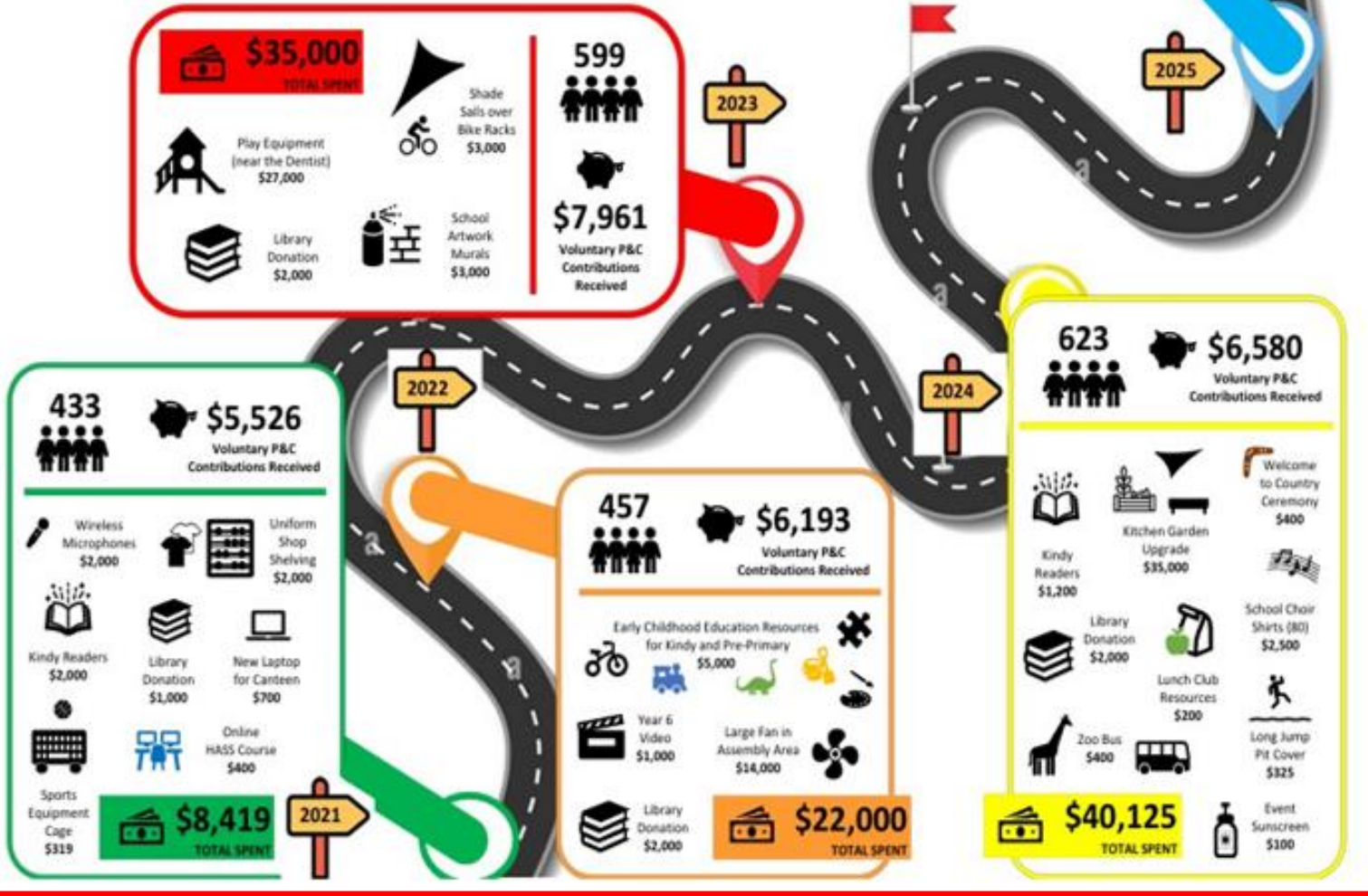

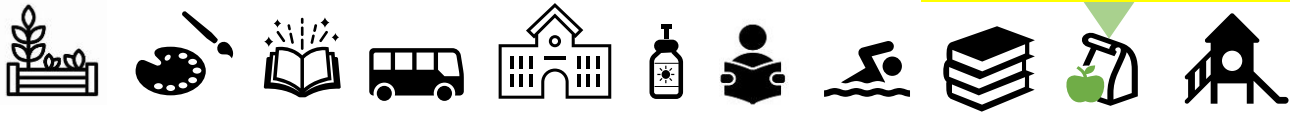

Canteen

The **onsite school canteen** is open on **Tuesdays and Wednesdays**. Online ordering close at 8:30am, no canteen counter sales for lunch orders. Items available include salad bowls, toasted / fresh sandwiches, party pies, sausage rolls (sauce squeeze-packs extra).

- **Tuesday Specials:** hamburgers /chicken burgers
- **Wednesday Specials:** Pizza / Hotdogs

Year 1-6 students may purchase Froyos, icy poles, fruit and popcorn from the canteen during afternoon Recess, 1:30 -1:50pm.

Lunchbox Hub online orders will be available on **Mondays, Thursdays, and Fridays**.

This service will continue while we have enough volunteers sorting orders into lunch crates.
